PASTOR'S MESSAGE



“As you bring your child to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with her among God's faithful people, bring her to the word of God and the holy supper, teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in her hands the holy scriptures, and nurture her in faith and prayer, so that your child may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life?”

(ELW, service of Holy Baptism, p. 228)

On February 19, Andy and I brought Norah to receive God's gift of baptism. As part of the service, we were reminded of the responsibilities listed above, and asked if we promised to follow through on them. When infants or children are baptized, their parents and baptismal sponsors (aka Godparents) make these promises on their behalf. Older children or adults who come to be baptized make these promises for themselves. When you are confirmed, you are asked these same questions. “Do

you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism?” (ELW, P. 236).

Because many of us were baptized as babies, we don't really remember the moment of our baptism. (And for those of you who were older and do remember, the rest of us are a little jealous!) I encourage parents to celebrate their child/ren's baptismal day each year - to light the candle given to them, to show them pictures, to tell them the stories of who was there and how they reacted when the water was poured over them. Baptism is a pivotal moment; God changes everything right then - and we want our children to be able to claim it, to know that it is real, that it matters. Most especially, we want them to know that God has claimed them as God's child forever, no matter what.

Lent is an opportunity for us to do that in our own lives - to return to the waters of baptism and claim God's promises for ourselves, to renew our commitment to the covenant God has made with us in baptism. It's a chance to go deeper, to listen again to the stories of what Christ has done for us, and to let the Holy Spirit put to death all the things within us that pull us away from God and God's ways, so that we may be raised to new life! One gospel acclamation sung during Lent calls us to “Return to the Lord, your God...” That is the invitation for us all this Lent - to come back to the waters of baptism, to put ourselves once again in God's hands, and to respond to God's gift of love with the offering of our whole lives. The promises we have made are a good place to start!

Also, remember that in keeping with the simplicity of season, we do not have altar flowers during Lent or Advent. In 2011, those dates are March 13 - April 17 and November 27 - December 18.

Obama Announces Intention to Appoint ELCA Presiding Bishop to Council

CHICAGO (ELCA) -- President Barack Obama announced Feb. 4 his intention to appoint the Rev. Mark S. Hanson, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), to the President's Advisory Council on Faith-based and Neighborhood Partnerships.

The advisory council brings together religious and secular leaders, as well as scholars and experts in fields related to the work of faith-based and neighborhood organizations, to make recommendations to the government on how to improve partnerships, according to a White House news release.

"I am pleased to announce that these experienced and committed individuals have agreed to join this Administration, and I look forward to working with them in the months and years ahead," Obama said.

In 2009 Hanson was appointed to a White House task force on interreligious dialogue and cooperation, through the Office of Faith-based and Neighborhood Partnerships.
