A Message from Pastor Alex:

It's no secret that I love Christmas lights. When I was a kid, I preferred the colorful ones, and to be honest it always annoyed me a bit that my parents put white lights on our Christmas tree, which to me were rather boring! Even so, my excitement quickly prevailed, especially once we started to hang ornaments like those old "magic" Hallmark ones from the early 90's that would light up and even move. Every year when my dad plugged those in, I would just stand there for a moment and marvel at our glorious tree.

As a teenager, when my Eagles fandom really started to kick in, I hung green Christmas lights all around my bedroom. How I managed to pull that one off and get parental approval, I do not know! I probably would have done the same to my college dorm room, too, had it not been for my roommate who, despite also being a lifelong Eagles fan, didn't love the idea of having green Christmas lights up the entire year! So we ultimately went with white instead. A far better choice, right?

Speaking of green and white lights, I actually hung white lights in the living room of the parsonage when I first moved in (although they came down a long time ago now!), and as some of you may recall, I also used to cover all the bushes in front of the parsonage in green Christmas lights during this time of year. Now it's just the light above my front door that I keep green and that's year-round. Go Birds:-)

Fast forward to December 2020. We were nine months into a pandemic and found ourselves having to remain isolated, quarantine, and practice social distancing. I must admit I felt quite lonely and discouraged that Advent as I prepared for a Christmas that was going to be unlike any other we had ever experienced, and it was!

And so, wanting (needing) to get outside and clear my head, what did I do that year? I hung Christmas lights in the memorial garden. Not colorful ones, mind you! That would have been too gaudy, and green, of course, was out of the question! No, instead I covered every bush with warm white lights, and with our statue of Jesus in the center and the lights twinkling behind him, it was truly a wondrous sight to behold!

This year, however, I decided to put those white lights out front so that every person passing by each night can see them. Who knows, maybe they'll draw someone in who's looking for a new church home or just a place to worship on Christmas Eve! I know I'd want to check out our church if I was driving by! I also added a beautiful nativity outside to remind us all the real "reason for the season" – the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, the Word who "became flesh and lived among us."

So instead of looking up in the night sky for mysterious drones, let us turn our gaze, our minds and our hearts toward the one who said, "I am the light of the world. Those who follow me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." Whenever I'm putting up Christmas lights I think of these words spoken by Immanuel (God with us), as well as the opening chapter in the gospel of John: "What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

Yes, the darkness of sin and death still lingers in our lives, and we all know what it's like to walk through that valley of the shadow of death. Indeed, sometimes it even feels like the whole world is covered in darkness, especially when we turn on the news and it's seemingly one tragedy, crime, scandal, act of violence, etc. after another. Jesus reminds us, of course, that this is nothing new, for "people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil."

And yet, there is good news, my friends. There is good news for you, for me, and for all people that gives us great joy, renewed hope, and everlasting peace: to us is born a savior who is Christ the Lord – not because we deserved Him, but because God so loved the whole world and sent that love down in Christ. As the prophet Isaiah declares: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined."

Do you see the light? Can you feel it warming your heart and calming all of your worries and fears? It's still here shining brightly in the darkness, and it always will be until Jesus, the light of the world, comes again to bring all things to completion. Until then, may we continue to let our light shine as together we follow Jesus in faith and in love.






