A Message from Pastor Alex:

Are you an optimist or a pessimist? Do you see the glass as being half full or half empty? Most of us probably fall somewhere in the middle depending on how we're feeling or what is happening in our lives. When you're in a bad mood or having a rough go of it, you're more likely to be a "Negative Nellie", right? I know I am! Conversely, when we are happy and all is relatively well in our lives, it's much easier, I think, to stay positive and look for the silver linings. Some days I can be so upbeat and hopeful. Other days I feel more like Eeyore from Winnie the Pooh. Perhaps you can relate.

The Psalmist, however, offers a different perspective for us to consider. Rather than looking at the glass as either half empty or half full, David declares that his cup runs over! Not just when he's feeling joyful or in times of prosperity and good health, but also in the midst of pain, grief, and suffering – even in the face of death: "Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows."

(Ps. 23:4-5)

Is your cup running over? You may not think it is. I'll be honest, sometimes mine feels anything but full! And yet, when I pause and take a moment to reflect and pray, when I remember what Jesus has done for me and for all of us, I don't see any emptiness or scarcity; I can't! No, all I see is abundance – countless blessings from the God who has given us life here on earth and life eternal in heaven through our Lord and savior Jesus Christ. Joined to him in baptism, our hope is secure – "a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul." (Heb. 6:19)

Trusting in this good news and remembering all that God has done and will continue to do for us in Christ, we can boldly proclaim God's greatness together. Thanks be to our faithful God who gives us all that we need and more than enough to share! Praise the Lord who fills our cup with every good gift and whose love for us never runs out!

Yes, we have so much to be thankful for in our lives, and as your pastor, I want you to know how truly thankful I am for you, for our congregation, and for this ministry we share here at SJILC! Whenever we're together, I see God's love at work in you. Whenever there is a need or an appeal for help, the people of this congregation step up every time without fail. Your faithfulness, generosity, and commitment to the Lord is a powerful inspiration to so many including myself!

So thank you, church! Thank you for sharing your time and the gifts that God has given you. Thank you for being a steadfast reminder that my cup truly is overflowing, as is yours! For God is good all the time, and all the time, God is so so good!






There are two ways that you can participate in donating for the Giving Tree this holiday season.

(1) The traditional Giving Tree with gift tags will be set up in the narthex on or about Nov. 9th. As we've done in the past, you may select the tag(s) you would like and sign the accompanying sheet with your name and the information requested.

(2) For those who are more comfortable donating gifts from home, we will have a selection of gift tags that you can choose from. If you are interested in donating this way, send an email or call by phone as outlined below, indicating how many gifts you would like to donate. You may request a specific age range, gift type (clothes/toys/etc), and/or a price range. **On a first response basis, you will be assigned gifts that match your requests as best as possible based on what is still available.** Please respond early for best selection. Once we receive your request and confirm the gifts you want to donate, a virtual tag with gift information will be emailed (or texted or mailed if you prefer) to you with instructions.

All donations need to be returned no later than Sunday, December 7th.

Gifts can be returned, unwrapped, in any of the following ways:

- Drop off in the assigned box in the narthex before or after church service, or anytime convenient (by calling ahead).
- Drop off in the outside drop off box at St. John-Incarnation, near the outside entrance to the Knotty Pine Room.
- Call the phone numbers as listed above for pick up of your gifts.

It is essential to begin and end this project early in order to get the gifts to their recipients in time for the holidays. Your generosity will bring joy to someone in need this holiday season and will reinforce the true meaning of Christmas.
