## ***Pastor's Reflection~***

Spring, my senior year in college, I found out that one of my favorite bands (Indigo Girls) was on tour and would be playing in a little theater in Erie, PA, near my hometown. Tickets were reasonable, and even better, the concert was on a Saturday night, meaning I could make the four-hour trip up home for the show without missing any classes – not that I would ever skip! ;) A whole bunch of us decided to go. Tickets were purchased, and only then did I realize there was a problem. The concert was during Holy Week, Holy Saturday, to be precise.

Now, for most college kids, that wouldn't have been an issue. They would have gone home on Good Friday, gone to the concert on Saturday, (maybe) gone to church at their home congregation on Sunday, and then gone back to school on Sunday afternoon. But by that point, I didn't really have a "home" congregation (I was a post-confirmation church drop-out, remember), and my parents had not been involved in church for a long time. My church roots were deeply established in the soil of my campus ministry congregation, and I couldn't imagine not being with them on two of the most important days of the church year (Good Friday and Easter) just so I could go to a concert.

So, I stayed at school for our evening Good Friday worship, picked up my friends Saturday morning, and headed home. We went to the concert (which was AWESOME), dropped my little sister and her friends off at my parents' house, and at about midnight or 12:30 got back on the road to return to State College. We arrived sometime after 4 AM, bleary-eyed and exhausted, but happy that we had gone, just as happy to be back. And at 10 AM Easter Sunday, I was back with my worshipping community to celebrate Christ's resurrection..

I hope that you have had that same experience, here at St. John's or somewhere else, of knowing that Holy Week worship is something you just *can't* miss, no matter what, of being willing to give up sleep or something else so that you can be in *your* church during the central week of the Christian year.

Holy Week, starting Palm Sunday and ending on Easter Sunday (April 1-8 this year), is at the heart of the Christian faith. We hear all year about the ways that God reveals God's love for us in Jesus, but it is during Holy Week that we see and experience that most clearly. We enter Jerusalem triumphantly with Jesus as the week begins, only to see it all turn sour and scary as Jesus is betrayed, arrested, and executed on Good Friday. It is only by going to the cross with Jesus on Friday that we can experience the joy of his rising again on Sunday. As the old children's chant goes, "you can't go over it, you can't go around it – you have to go through it." **Just so, we have to go *through* the event of the cross on Good Friday in order to really "get" the significance of Easter.**

This year, we're doing something different during Holy Week. Usually, we observe what is known as Palm/Passion Sunday, where we start with the story of Jesus coming into Jerusalem as we gather and then read the Passion Narrative together as a congregation in the middle of worship. We then hear stories from John's gospel on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday (the passion again), before going back to the year's assigned gospel (Mark, this year) to hear the resurrection story on Sunday. This year, though, we've decided to change this just a bit. Palm Sunday will primarily focus on Palm Sunday. We won't have the reading of the Passion story on Sunday morning – we'll hold off until Good Friday. We'll hear from Mark's gospel on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter, so we'll get his version of Holy Week uninterrupted. Worship will look a little different on Thursday and Friday as well. Sometimes we get stuck in a worship rut, but if ever we should try to break out of the rut and experience the story anew, it's during Holy Week!

What this means for you is that you really *need* to come to worship during Holy Week. It won't be enough simply to come on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, if you want to experience the depth and drama of this pivotal event in the life of the church and the world. What happens in Holy Week changes *everything!* But you won't be able to feel that in all its fullness unless you come. My hope and prayer for you this Lent and Holy Week is that you will find that there's no place else you'd rather be, and you'll do whatever it takes to be here (although I don't recommend driving through the middle night!).
