



Barbara Semmig Memorial Scholarship Fund

<u>1994</u>

The women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (WELCA) of the then St. John Lutheran church started a fund that would benefit the active young adults in the congregation to pursue their dreams in higher education. WELCA elected Nan Moser as the chairperson of this project. It was decided by the committee that the fund would be called <u>The Barbara Semmig</u> <u>Memorial Scholarship Fund</u>.

<u> 1995 – Present</u>

Garage sales, church members and community contributions made it possible to award our first scholarship. To date we have awarded 50 young adults who met the necessary criteria to receive a scholarship by their involvement in church activities and community service.

Barbara Semmig

Barbara Semmig was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church who was very active on many committees. Barbara always had a smile and was ready to help in any capacity. Barbara was known as "St. John's Grandmother" who always had candy on hand for the children. She was instrumental in establishing St. John's participation in the Lynbrook Village Memorial Day Parade. As far as Barbara extending her influence and commitment to the community of the Incorporated Village of Lynbrook, Barbara was quite active and was honored by being named Lynbrook Woman of the Year.

Barbara Semmig Scholarship Fund Revised Guidelines

The Barbara Semmig Scholarship Fund was established in 1995 by the women (WELCA) of St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church to provide educational opportunities and support its members. Recognizing the importance of further education and its financial challenges, the scholarship aims to recognize students for their involvement in the church.

To be eligible for the Barbara Semmig Scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. **Membership**: Applicants must be a member of St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church.
- 2. **Church Involvement**: Applicants should demonstrate active participation in church activities such as attending services, volunteering, and leadership roles.
- 3. Academic Achievement: Applicants should possess a strong academic record or show significant potential for academic success.

Interested applicants for the Barbara Semmig Scholarship must write an essay addressing St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church. The essay typically includes personal information, academic achievements, a statement of faith and a description of their involvement within the church:

- Involvement in the church: A detailed account of the applicant's participation, leadership roles, and contributions within the St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church.
- Involvement in the local community: A description of the applicant's engagement in community service, volunteer work or other activities that have positively impacted the local community.
- Institution of higher learning and goals: The name of the institution of higher learning the applicant plans to attend and their educational goals at that institution.
- Post-education aspirations: An outline of the applicant's intentions and plans upon completion of their education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and assess each candidate.

The committee will consider aspects such as active participation, academic achievements, leadership potential and commitment to the church community.

The committee will divide the applicants into two tiers based on their level of involvement within the church:

- **Tier 1**: This tier is the highest award for applicants who have consistently demonstrated active involvement in the life of St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church.
- **Tier 2**: This tier is an acknowledgement award to support members who may have been less actively engaged due to personal circumstances or other commitments but express a genuine desire to reconnect and become more involved within the church.

The Barbara Semmig Scholarship is a commitment on behalf of St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church to promote lifelong learning, spiritual growth and the success of its members.
