# A Message from Pastor Alex

What an awesome gift it was to celebrate another Advent and Christmas season with all of you in worship. From the beautiful music offered by our organist, Judy Pang, and our church choir directed by Allison Koehler to the splendor of God's sanctuary with all the lights, paraments, and Christmas decorations (not to mention our marvelous Advent wreath), the services here at St. John's were truly wonderful. I cannot thank our worship committee enough for your continued help and hard work. Without each one of you, our worship wouldn't be possible!

Now it's a new year... 2015 to be exact. God has lovingly blessed us once again with the birth of a Son and now we think about the possibilities of the year to come: plans, goals, hopes, maybe even fears. How many of you made a New Year's resolution this year? I'm sure some of you did, making a vow to improve yourself in a certain way or do something kind for someone else. Maybe you promised to lose weight by eating healthier and exercising more (the gyms are always packed in January. February is a different story). Perhaps you've sworn to quit smoking, drink less alcohol, manage your stress better, or simply get away and go on a trip. Maybe you're determined to get a degree, a promotion, or a better job. Or perhaps you made an oath to pray more, be closer to God, or volunteer some time to help those in need.

Let's vow to continue to dedicate ourselves to the calling that Christ has given us as we share God's love with those in this community. With God's help and blessing, we CAN do this together and we WILL. See you in worship!
