Pastor's Report 2024

As presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting January 26, 2025



At the end of his book, <u>The Pastor: A Spirituality</u>, author Gordon W. Lathrop writes the following: "In Gian Carlo Menotti's opera *Amahl and the Night Visitors*, one of the Magi—seemingly nearly mad—carries around a portable box of personal treasures and candies. With Amahl himself as audience, he sings the wonderful song, 'This is my box. This is my box. I never travel without my box!'... I think that pastors never travel without this box: Word and Sacraments full of the gospel of Jesus Christ for a needy assembly, for a needy world. Bread. In fact, I think that there are no real pastors without this box. Maybe slightly mad, beggars all, carrying this box and bringing out its astonishing contents constitutes their spirituality."

Well, I too carry a box with me when I make pastoral visits, whether it be at the hospital or in someone's home, and like that one Magi, I never travel without it! This precious box, which holds the sacrament of Holy Communion, is kept in my truck so that I have it wherever I go and whenever it's needed. (Sadly, I finally had to "retire" my first one at the start of 2024, which was actually my great-grandfather's Communion kit that he used during his ministry! I was able to get one last decade out of that very special box, and now it sits in my office as a reminder of my beloved Gramps and all the faithful believers that it fed and nourished over the years.)

My new Communion kit certainly saw plenty of use in 2024 as I brought out its "astonishing contents" on countless occasions. I spent more time visiting parishioners in hospitals, nursing homes, rehabilitation centers, etc. than ever before in my ministry, which was challenging at times, but also very rewarding. Indeed, the longer I'm a pastor the more I realize what a privilege it truly is to be able to pray with those who are suffering, or bless someone who is dying, or give Jesus to a person who hasn't had Communion in months or even years. These are incredibly sacred experiences for me as a pastor – indescribable, really – and I give thanks to God for them just as I do for all the miracles and healings and moments of joy in your lives and in my own!

Yes, we are all beggars, as Martin Luther once wrote, and this includes your perhaps slightly mad pastor. I'll admit there are days when I feel unworthy and ill-equipped for this call to ministry. There are times when I am completely overwhelmed with doubt and despair, and I find myself asking the same question over and over again: "Why, Lord?"

Don't get me wrong, I love being a pastor, and the blessings of this vocation definitely outweigh the burdens (especially here at St. John-Incarnation Lutheran Church! ②). However, ministry can still be very wearing and wearying, and the risk for burnout is always there. The statistics back it up.

So aside from making sure to take my days off and spend time with my family in PA when I can, I also try to accept my limitations and not be so hard on myself. This is much easier said than done, of course, and when I struggle with it, I remember what the Lord said to Paul: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Cor. 12:9)

Yes, God's grace is more than enough for us, and like Paul, I trust that "whenever I am weak, then I am strong" because I know that Christ dwells within me! Everything else I take to the Lord in prayer – the One who called me to ministry and has given me all the gifts that I need for the journey. I thank God for being with me on my good days and my bad ones, and I thank God every day for blessing me with this awesome congregation – a congregation that not only loves me and supports me, but more importantly is faithful to its mission of sharing the love of Jesus with all.

A few notable highlights from 2024:

- **New Members** we officially welcomed four more new members into the congregation Barbara Brown, Tom & Vicky Jackson, and Anne Moffat. Hopefully there will be many more in 2025!
- "Ashes to Go!" in addition to giving out ashes to the commuters at the Lynbrook Train Station and to the senior citizens at Greis Park, I also gave ashes to the residents and staff at the rehab and nursing home in Island Park. As I like to say, when people can't get to church, it's our job to bring the church to them, and "Ashes to Go" is one of the many ways that we do that here at SJILC.
- **Hometown Nazareth VBS** 22 children and 8 youth joined us in August for another great week of Vacation Bible School! A huge thank you once again to everyone who contributed and helped out in any capacity, especially my fellow co-director, Gabrielle Barry, and our church secretary, Andrea Sommella. We have yet to pick a theme for 2025 so if you have any ideas or want to help with that, please let me know and we'll start planning!
- Serving as Coverage Pastor at Grace Lutheran Church in Malverne this was a first for me and a role that, frankly, I was a bit reluctant to take on. However, after much prayer and with the support and approval of the council, I decided to accept the call and serve as Grace's coverage pastor, which began at the end of May and concluded the second week in December with Grace calling their next pastor, the Rev. L.B. Tatum. I really enjoyed getting to know the people at Grace, and I learned some new things in observing how their congregation functions and does ministry. Leading the chapel services for the students at the school was by far my favorite part!

As we look ahead to 2025, I remain very optimistic and hopeful that this will be the year that we finally sell the Cedarhurst property and can move forward in our congregation's long-term planning. One area that I'd like us to focus on in 2025 is how we can become a more *inviting* church and not just a welcoming one. There are many people in our community who do not have a church home and are looking for one. They are young and old, rich and poor, formerly "churched" and "unchurched", and yet, all are seeking and longing to be a part of something bigger than themselves just like us. Can we be that place? Can we commit ourselves not only to the ministry of this congregation, but also its reach? How will our neighbors know about us? The council has already begun this conversation, and thanks to Tom Sargent and our Synod, we also have access to the demographics of our surrounding community. With the new apartments across the street opening this summer, for example, we have some amazing opportunities to welcome <u>and</u> invite!

What a blessing that we are able to share God's love with a hungry and needy world! What a joy to know the gospel of Jesus Christ and bring this good news to others! Let us continue to love one another as Christ loves us, that all may know us by our love that He has given us. It is an honor to serve as your pastor and be your partner in this ministry we share. Thank you!
